DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (If known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The first church was a log structure built near the mouth of Warrior ^{Run} about three miles from the present building.

A second structure, also log, was begun in 1789 and stood in front of the present church. The present Warrior Run Church was erected in 1835 of red brick and is basically Greek Revival in design but modified by rural influences. It has two paneled front doors with semicircular fanlights and five bay sides with louvered shutters around the windows. The church has four Doric columns across the front supporting a portico, but they are further apart than the true Greek ones and the triangular pediment over the columns is somewhat higher than the classic stone ones. The interior reflects the simplicity of the rural atmosphere with old box pews and plain pulpit.

The church was restored to its original appearance in 1947 by the Warrior Run chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution. There have been no exterior changes but the early nineteenth century furnishings were restored in 1959 by removing later nineteenth and twentieth century additions.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Warrior Run Presbyterian Church serves as a memorial to the hearty Scots-Irish people who played a leading role in settling the frontier. Architecturally, the church is an excellent example of a rural interpretation of the Greek Revival temple style popularized in northern Pennsylvania, New York, and areas of New England in the 1820's through 1840's.

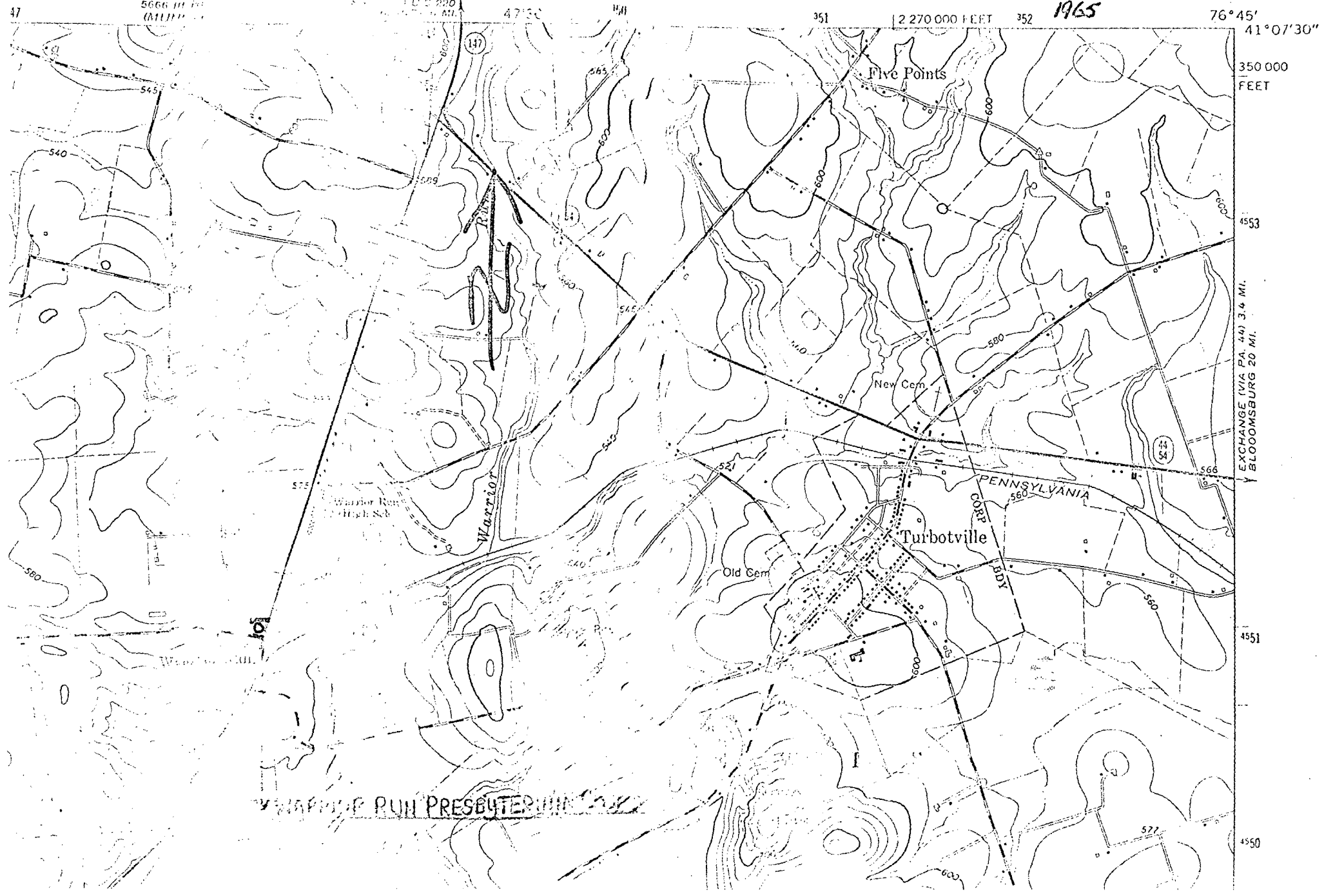
