DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Heisey House is a two and one-half story dwelling characteristic of the nineteenth century "Gingerbread Age." The house was built of brick in 1833 and covered with stucco to give it a grey appearance. The facade is five bays across with a portico running the length of the front. Twin gables of the A-frame type featuring Gothic Revival "gingerbread" trim protrude from the front of the house. The porch, gables, and a bay on the right side of the house were added sometime between 1870 and 1875. The windows, enhanced by shutters, are 2-over-2 sashes. Three red brick chimneys adorn the roof. The interior of the house, done in the Victorian mode, is substantially unaltered. The Heisey House, operated as a museum by the Clinton County Historical Society, houses a collection of early and mid-nineteenth century furniture.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Heisey House was the first brick dwelling built in the city of Lock Haven. Canal boats were used to transport the bricks into the lumbering area. In its early days, the house was a tavern and inn, where Jeremiah Church, the founder of Lock Haven, boarded for a time. The tavern, one of the earliest in Lock Haven, was run by Roger Devling (Develin) and his son John, who emigrated from Ireland. From 1875 to 1960 the house was in the possession of the Heisey family. After 1960, the house was taken over by the Clinton County Historical Society. Today it is used as headquarters for the society and as a museum which is open to the public.

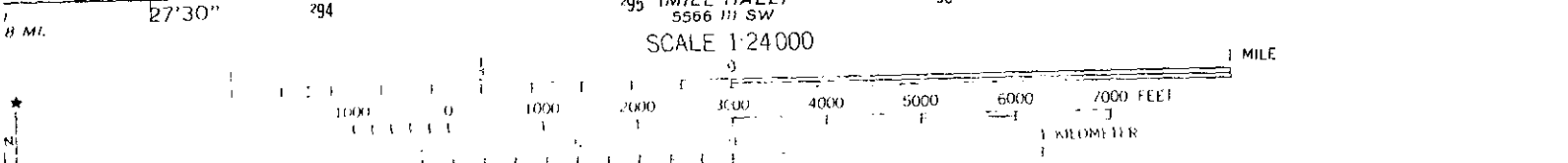
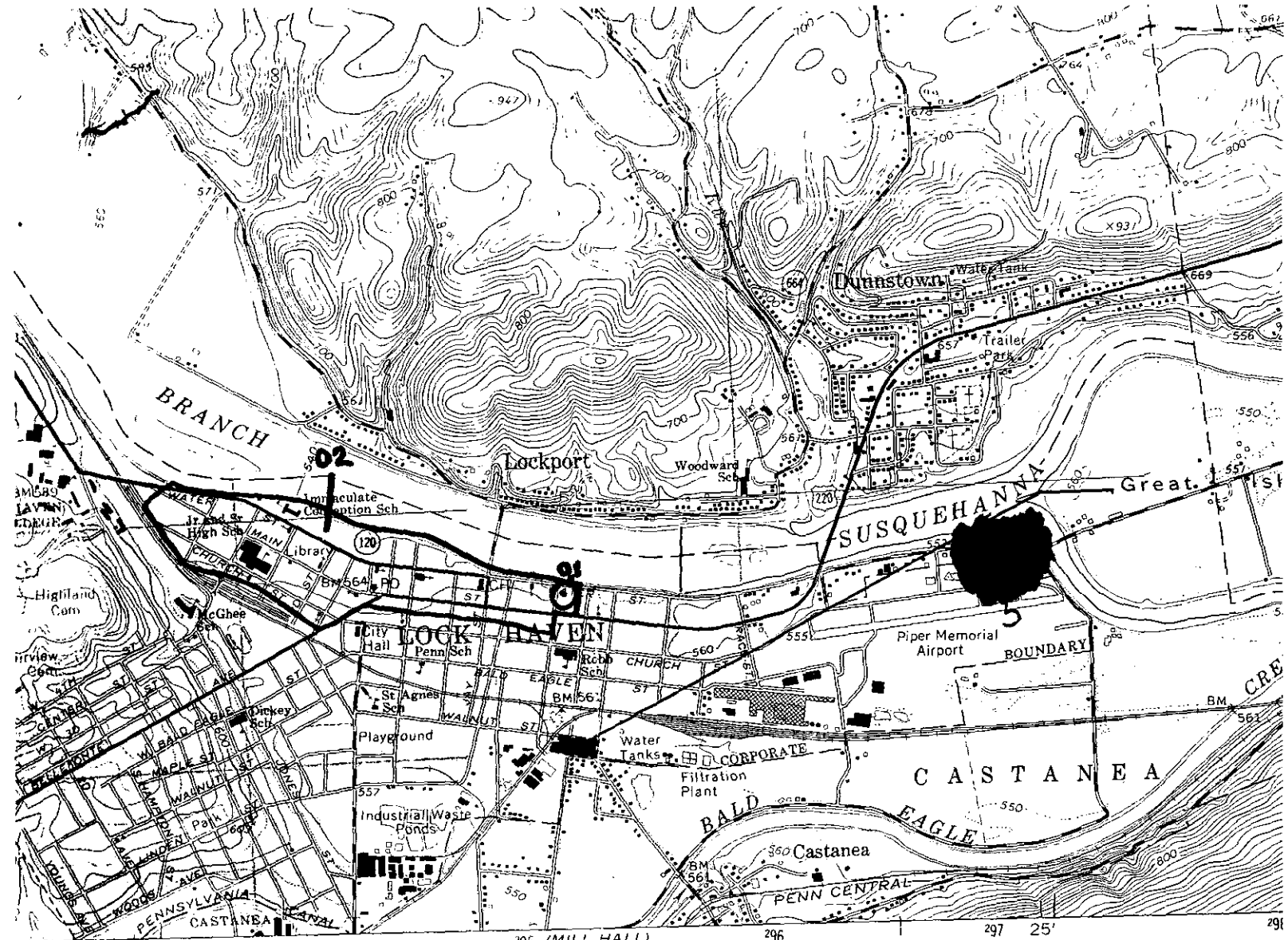
