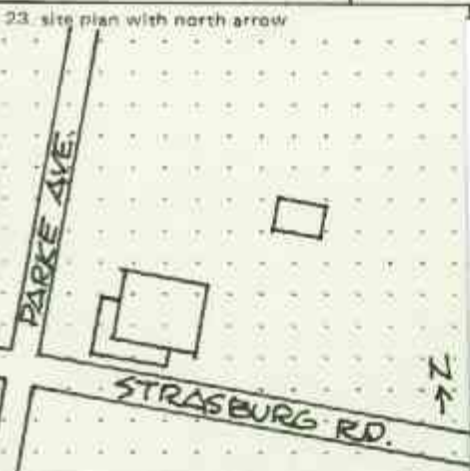

Seven bays wide, two story, Queen Anne Revival house with horizontal boards and shingles on the facades and a slate shingled hipped roof. The interior brick chimney is inconsequential in comparison to the large steep conical turret roof to the west of it. The large one over one light windows have solid shutters on the first floor and louvered shutters on the second floor. Other design features of this house include: two story bay window, two story hipped roof portico porch, one story curved veranda and 2 hipped roofed dormers.
