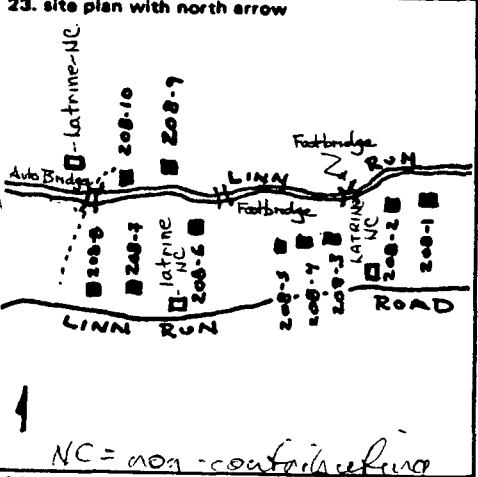

26. brief description (note unusual features, integrity, environment, threats and associated buildings)
 Linn Run State Park is an area of 565 acres within Forbes State Forest in Westmoreland County. A single historic district, encompassing the family cabin area, is proposed. The district, located along both banks of Linn Run, contains thirteen buildings and three structures.

27. history, significance and/or background
 The CCC and the Works Progress Administration (WPA) jointly developed Linn Run State Park. There is some indication from secondary sources that the WPA constructed the cabins and other buildings and structures, while the CCC landscaped the logged over area and constructed roads, water and sewage systems, and other utilities. Despite the uncertainty as to which agency actually constructed the buildings and structures in the park, the Linn Run State Park

Three of the buildings are non-contributing resources.

- Cabin No. 1 (208-1) L-plan cabin clad with wane-edged siding. Cross-gabled roof, with one gable, supported on stone piers, forming a porch. Stone chimney on rear wall.
- Cabin No. 2 (208-2) L-plan cabin with front wall, which incorporates a stone chimney, and one side wall constructed of stone. Remaining walls, and small appendage attached to rear wall, clad with wane-edged siding. Cross-gabled roof, with one gable, supported on stone piers, forming a porch.
- Cabin No. 3 (208-3) Square-plan cabin clad with wane-edged siding. Stone chimney, incorporated into front wall, penetrates center of pyramidal roof. Inset porch with stone piers and squared timber supports.
- Cabin No. 4 (208-4) Similar to Cabin No. 2.
- Cabin No. 5 (208-5) Similar to Cabin No. 2.
- Cabin No. 6 (208-6) L-plan cabin with rear wall, which incorporates a stone chimney, and one side wall constructed of stone. Remaining walls clad with wane-edged siding. Cross-gabled roof, with one gable, supported by stone piers, forming a porch.
- Cabin No. 7 (208-7) Double-pen, gable-roofed cabin clad with wane-edged siding. Cross gable forms porch roof supported by stone piers. Stone chimney on rear elevation.
- Cabin No. 8 (208-6) Similar to Cabin No. 1.
- Cabin No. 9 (208-9) T-plan cabin clad with wane-edged siding. Cross-gabled roof. Inset porch with log columns.
- Cabin No. 10 (208-6) Similar to Cabin No. 7.

Other CCC-built resources within the district include two stone foot bridges, an automobile bridge constructed of steel I-beams with stone abutments, and low profile stone cooking fireplaces.

The three non-contributing resources are modern latrines, of unknown construction date.

appears to meet Criteria A and C for listing in the National Register of Historic Places. It is associated with the Emergency Conservation Work performed by the Civilian Conservation Corps, one of the most important of the federal relief efforts initiated under the New Deal, an exceptionally significant development in the twentieth century history of the United States. These buildings and structures also exemplify the rustic style of architecture espoused by the National Park Service. This style and philosophy have come to characterize most national and state parks in the United States.

More specifically, the Linn Run State Park Family Cabin Historic District is significant in the following areas:

Architecture/Landscape Architecture:

These buildings and structures epitomize the rustic style and philosophy of architecture espoused by the National Park Service. Rustic buildings and structures are designed to blend with the natural environment. They make use of local, natural materials and represent a perceived notion of pioneer American architecture. Buildings are placed on the landscape so as not to detract from the natural environment.

Conservation/Recreation:

These buildings and structures have been used as recreational facilities for approximately fifty years. They represent the results of a massive federal effort to construct and improve outdoor recreational facilities across the United States.

Politics/Government:

These buildings and structures were constructed by the Civilian Conservation Corps (CCC), one of the most important federal relief programs created under Roosevelt's New Deal. They are thus representative of the federal building programs that constituted one of the major developments of the Depression Era. Built on state-owned property, they also represent an unprecedented cooperation between state and federal government.

Social/Humanitarian:

The buildings and structures constructed by the CCC constitute a massive humanitarian program initiated by the federal government during the depths of the Depression. The construction of these buildings employed thousands of jobless young men, many of whom were homeless before they joined the Civilian Conservation Corps.

Boundary Information

Beginning at a point on the north side of Linn Run Road approximately 100 feet west of the west end of the cabin area loop road, thence north approximately 500 feet to a point. Thence east approximately 1,500 feet to a point. Thence south approximately 300 feet to a point on the north side of Linn Run Road. Thence west along the north side of Linn Run Road approximately 1,600 feet to the starting point. These boundaries contain all of the resources associated with the Linn Run State Park Family Cabin Historic District.

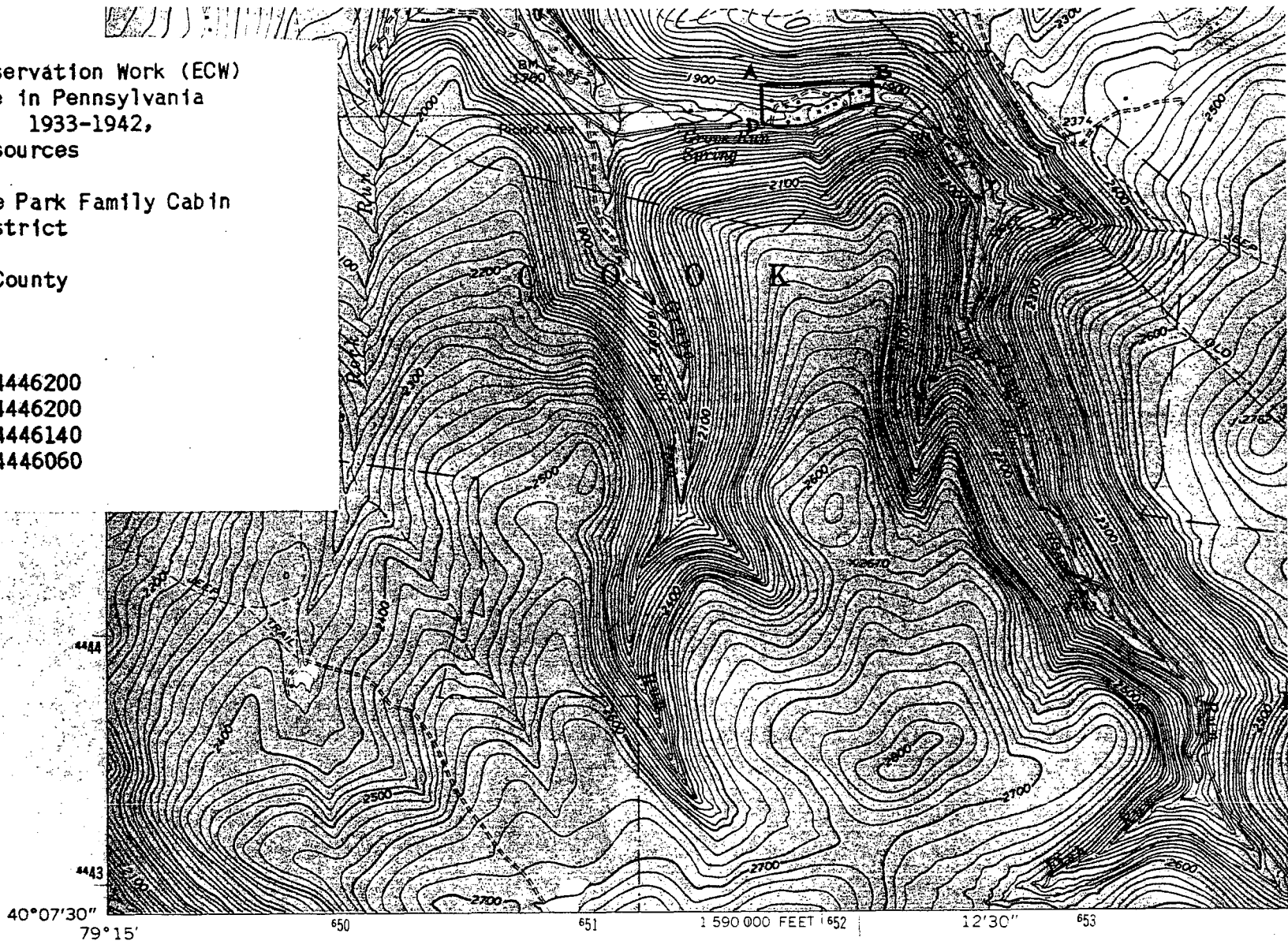

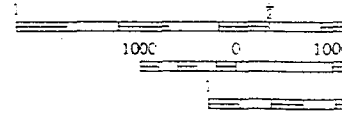
