DESCRIPTION OF APPEARANCE:

Mapleton Farm and Garden is located in Mapleton, just south of Route 22. This 40 x 35-foot, three-and-a-half-story frame feed mill has wood clapboarding, a concrete block foundation, and a cross-gabled metal roof with a small fourth-story section housing the top of the elevator. It dates to 1914. There is a two-story frame addition and a series of semi-open one-story lumber and coal bins attached to the east side of the main building which date to the 1920s, and a one-story frame addition which dates to about 1917-18 on the west side of the mill. Four large frame storage sheds have been built on the property over the years. To the west of the mill are two grain storage sheds, the closest of which dates to 1970 and connects to one which dates to 1937. The earlier is two stories and the later one story, both are frame. Facing these two is a 1960 one story frame feed storage building. Southeast of this is a one story frame garage which dates to 1930. A railroad siding ran along the north side of the mill.

Soon after the mill was completed, Andrews added the coal and lumber storage shed and became a coal dealer as well. In 1917-18, he installed equipment for milling flour, but continued this product line for only a few years. The same business is now handled by what is called Mapleton Farm and Garden, which conducts business in buildings which retain their original character and use. Much of the original milling equipment remains in use although some has been removed.

SIGNIFICANCE:

This feed and, later, flour mill developed as an outgrowth of H.O. Andrews' stave mill and contracting interests. In 1908, he and a group of area farmers began buying feed by the rail car load, and in 1914 Andrews hired Anderson Dell to construct a mill for grinding and storing feed.

The H.O. Andrews Mill is eligible under Criterion A associated with an important industry in Huntingdon County. It is a fine example of an early twentieth century feed mill complex that continues to operate as a mill in Huntingdon County. The later additions and changes to the buildings are expansions of the original industrial use. Some of the machinery is still in use.

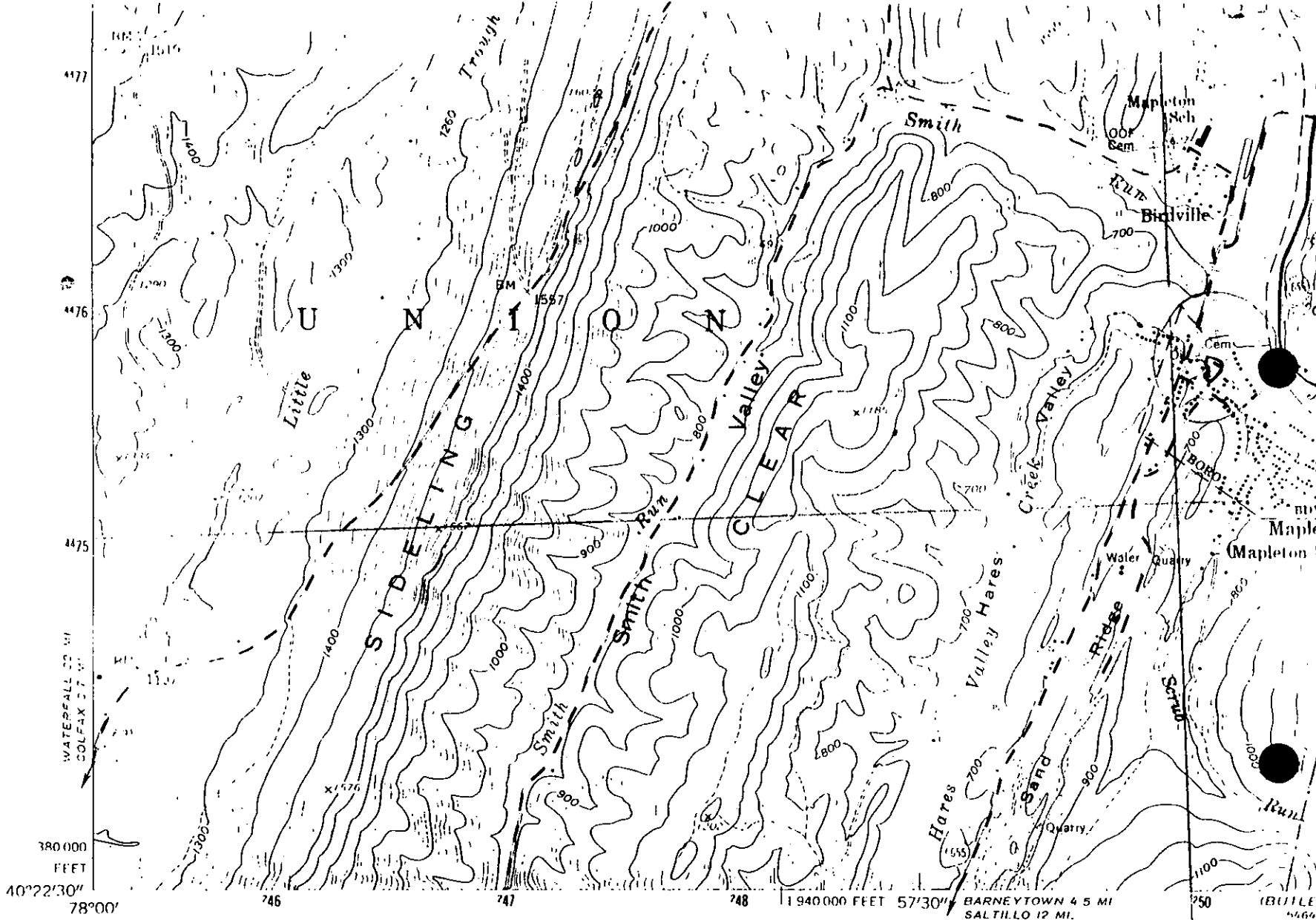

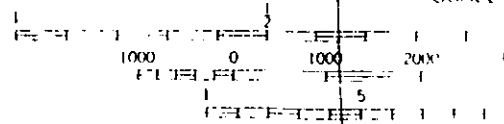
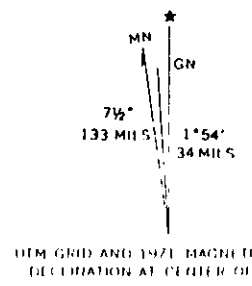
