Describe present and historic physical appearance.

The L. G. Sherman Tobacco Warehouse has a rectangular plan and dates from c. 1900. The eight bay by two bay brick building is on a hill at the southeast corner of North Marshall and East Marion Streets. The building is two stories in height over a raised basement. The basement is very high, particularly at the northeast end, giving the building a three-story appearance. All fenestrations are surmounted by brick segmental arches. The window openings have rectangular six-over-six set in wooden sash with wooden sills; some have storm windows. The roof is flat with stone copings and has parapets at the north and south elevations. The building has good integrity.

The west elevation presents an eight-bay facade to North Marshall Street. At the high basement level there is a shipping entrance with double doors. The first floor has a raised shop entrance at the fifth bay with a wooden platform and double flight of stairs; a loading dock is at the eighth bay. All other The north and south elevations each are two bays have windows. bays deep. The southwest corner of the building had an indentation, according to the Sanborn map of 1897 (updated to 1904); there was also a one-story small addition at the southeast By 1912 the addition had been demolished and the indentation filled so that the south elevation was in conformity with the north elevation. The south elevation is two stories high with a parapeted roof ending in a brick chimney at the southeast corner. At the first floor level a door and transom were added; at grade level a service door was added. The east elevation is not accessible.

The integrity of the warehouse is good. Although the south elevation was altered c. 1910, the general configuration of the building, brickwork, and fenestrations have been little changed. The building presently houses an engineering firm.

State significance of property, and justify criteria, criteria considerations, and areas and periods of significance noted above.

The L. G. Sherman Tobacco Warehouse is significant under criteria A and C. It is a member of the tobacco processing and manufacturing property type under the multiple property nomination: Tobacco Buildings in Lancaster City. It is significant as an integral part of one of Lancaster City's most important latenineteenth—and early—twentieth—century industries, the processing and storage of cigar leaf tobacco. The building is representative of a large body of industrial buildings in the city in the early twentieth century. It is a good example of the sparsely ornamented flat—roof version of the property type with raised parapets, prevalent at that time.

This brick warehouse at the corner of East Marion and West Marshall Streets is shown on the 1897 (updated to 1904) Sanborn map as being L. G. Sherman's Tobacco Warehouse. The owner was G. Whistler.

In 1912 Jno. McLaughlin & Co. and Jacob Bowman & Bro. occupied the building. Bowman also had a tobacco warehouse and leaf "sweating" (curing) business on East Grant Street (see National Register nomination, Bowman, Jacob, Tobacco Warehouse, submitted 1990), and later occupied a warehouse on New Holland Avenue (see National Register nomination, Basch & Fisher Tobacco Warehouse, submitted 1990). On the 1912 (updated to 1947) Sanborn map the building was shown as being used as a tobacco station and service warehouse.
